## Brown in Control



Paul Brown clinched the Pirelli World Challenge GTS Championship this September at Mazda Raceway Laguna Seca in Monterey California.

If none of that makes since to you, this will. Paul Brown is our own Sylvia Musil's son.

Paul has been racing for 20+ years. Some of the cars he races are called vintage race cars and worth over million dollars.

Currently he is racing a 2012 prototype Mustang furnished by Ford Motor Company. He is ranked number one in

his field. It is interesting that the drivers are only allowed to make minor changes to the car they race; for example, they are not allowed to touch the motor. One example of a change that Paul has made on this car is the shocks; they are from the Netherlands and cost \$10,000 a pair. Another change Paul has made is the aerodynamic hood and wing on the back of the car. These parts are designed by Paul himself and then sold as after-market-body parts.

It will surprise most this sport is truly for fun. Not to mention the thrill of driving 180 miles per hour. Think about that when you are going 75 MPH down the interstate and someone passes you...

Historically, Paul has tied Parnelli Jones; a renown racecar driver in his number of wins. Paul has the opportunity to surpass that record in Atlanta Georgia the end of September.
